It is hard to believe we are finishing the first semester of the 2014-2015 school year, and we will be starting the second semester in a few weeks. We have had a very productive first semester for Tri-County North Middle and High School, and we are looking forward to starting the second semester.

Our 8th graders had another successful trip to Washington D.C. in November. We were able to visit the Capital, several museums, Arlington National Cemetery, The White House, Mt. Vernon, and several other attractions in D.C. The students were outstanding, and we received numerous positive comments about the behavior and attitude of the students.

During the second semester, the Middle and High School will start their second phase of the Measures of Academic Performance (MAP) testing in January, and the high school will also be taking their semester exams in January. During both of these testing, we will be on block scheduling with alternating days for each period to allow for additional time to complete the MAP testing and exams.

The second semester brings the administration of high stakes testing for students with the Ohio Graduation Tests for sophomores; end of course exams for students enrolled in the following classes: Algebra I, Geometry, English 9, English 10, Physical Science, American History, and Government. The students in grades 6th through 8th will take the Next Generation Tests in Math and Language Arts. Performance Based Assessments will be given to students in grades 6th: Language Arts, Math, and Social Studies. 7th grade: Language Arts, Math. 8th Grade: Language Arts, Math,

Science. 9th grade: Language Arts, Math. 10th grade: Language Arts, Math. Please pay attention to the TCN website, Facebook, and communication from the school for the dates of all of the testing students will be taking from now until the end of the school year.

The Middle and High School will hold their second parent-teacher conference on February 12, 2014 between 2:30 p.m.-8:30 p.m. We will also hold a 7th grade parent meeting at 6:00 p.m. to discuss the Washington D.C. trip next year, and we will hold a 8th grade parent meeting at 7:00 p.m. to discuss scheduling for the 9th grade in 2015-2016 school year. Both of these meetings will be held in the lecture room.

Kindergarten Registration

The Tri-County North 2015-2016 Kindergarten Registration will be handled a little differently this year to coordinate with other schools in our county and in conjunction with Early Literacy Week.

This year, TCN will hold open kindergarten registration for next year's kindergarteners from **April 13–April 17, 2015 from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. in the District Office.** Simply choose a day and stop in to register your child between that time frame, no appointment needed. 2015-2016 Kindergarteners must be five years old on or before August 1, 2015, and parents must provide the following:

1. Original Birth Certificate (NOT birth record from the hospital)
2. Physician's Immunization Records
3. Original copies of any child custody order, decrees or modifications of order relevant to the child
4. THREE current forms of proof of residency (please refer to www.tcnschools.com for acceptable forms of proof)

Kindergarten screening will be held in August in the Elementary building and will be discussed at registration.
