National Financial Literacy Challenge: the following students scored in the top 25th percentile of the National Financial Literacy Challenge (a total of 46,000 students across the U.S. took the challenge). HSTW Assessment Student Results: Alex Baker, Lindsay Bussard, Greg Eley, Micah Hammaker, Lane Hart, Garrett Lawson, Shelly Seibel earned the High Schools That Work (HSTW) Award of Educational Achievement. HS Seniors who complete a challenging and focused program of study and demonstrate readiness for employment and for college studies receive the award. Students qualify for the award by completing

a college-preparatory course of study in at least two of three subject areas (English/language arts, mathematics or science); completing a concentration in a career/technical area, mathematics/science or the humanities; and meeting readiness goals in all three subject areas on the HSTW Assessment.

State of Ohio Science Fair: the following students qualified for the District Science Fair at the University of Cincinnati: Dylan Hemmerich (Excellent), Emily Broughton (Excellent), Victoria Flora (Superior) and Aaron Patrick (Superior). Victoria and Aaron advanced to the State Science Fair where they received Superior ratings. Victoria achieved a perfect score, while Aaron was within two points of a perfect score. Over 1,000 students competed.

TrigStar Exam: the TrigStar Exam was given to over 150 high school students across the state. TCN continued the recent tradition of having students place in the state. Helena Petrova scored a perfect score and finished 2nd in the state. Amanda Roberts finished 3rd in the state and Lindsay Bussard scored a 4th place finish!

Sixth Grade Students Visit Dearborn, Michigan

The 6th grade took an overnight field trip to Dearborn, MI on May 15th-16th. Prior to leaving, the students completed an interdisciplinary unit on Henry Ford and his contributions. In language arts, students were assigned a person who would be showcased in either the Henry Ford Museum or the Greenfield Village to research. Students researched their assigned person looking for basic biographical information as well as information about the invention or contribution that the person made. The information was then made into PowerPoint presentations. The students really enjoyed seeing the homes, inventions or other pieces of history that related to their historical figure. In science, the students studied the assembly line and the advancements it provided for production and industry. In social studies, students mapped the countries that provide raw materials that are used to make Fords.

Finally, in math, students discussed the importance and significance of the \$5 a day that Henry Ford implemented. They then compared the cost of cars versus salary then and now.

The students had a great time on the trip and were able to see some unique pieces of history. While in Dearborn, the students had the opportunity to learn more about some of the most important men and women in history. Their first stop was at the Ford Rouge Truck Plant where the Ford F-150 is manufactured. After touring the plant, students spent the afternoon at the Henry Ford Museum. Some highlights of the museum were the Rosa Parks Bus, the Oscar Mayer Weiner mobile. John F. Kennedy's limousine and the chair that Abraham Lincoln was assassinated in. The next day, students visited Henry Ford's estate where they learned about what a truly amazing







inventor Henry Ford was. They also spent the afternoon at Greenfield Village where they saw a number of famous homes including the Wright Brothers' birthplace, George Washington Carver's birthplace and Thomas Edison's laboratory.

The trip was educational, fun and a great opportunity for all students! We would like to thank the school board, parents and the community for their support in making this trip possible.



On March 20th, the Trigonometry/Pre-Calculus and Calculus classes participated in the TrigStar Exam. The exam is sponsored by the American Society of Professional Surveyors as a means of promoting surveying and mapping as career choices. TCN has participated for the last three years. We recently received the state results and are excited to announce that three of the top five scores in the state of Ohio were TCN students! Taking 2nd in the state was Helena Pet-
