



### Healthy Eating Tips 🖣

Drink plenty of water every day for soft, plump skin and well-hydrated system.

Six small meals spread throughout the day can help keep blood sugar levels stable and keep you mentally alert. Greens and beans are great cancer-protectors. Think cabbage, spinach, broccoli; French, kidney, chickpeas, soya. For a healthy breakfast, blend strawberries, papaya and half a banana with skimmed milk and ice cubes.

Oregano is high in antioxidants and tastes great finely chopped and scattered over salads, grilled meats and fish.

Lack of water can make you think you're hungry for food, leading to overeating. Drink at least two liters daily.

Cut calories in small ways—have fewer snacks, smaller portions, chew food slowly when full, have smaller meals. When you prepare meat and poultry, trim off all the visible fat and always choose lean cuts.

Store fruits and salads where they're visible in the fridge so you remember to eat them.
