# From The Desk of The Superintendent william Derringer

I would like to thank the Tri-County North Community for, once again, supporting our levy for operating expenses. The final count was approximately 62% in favor of the renewal. It is nice to know that we have a community that supports our efforts to provide the best education possible for our students. I would also like to thank the "Citizens of TCN" committee and everyone who allowed us to place signs in their yard or showed support in some other way. We will continually strive to make Tri-County North an excellent school for our children!

To date, we have used seven calamity days this winter. The state allows five days to be used before we are required to use make-up days. For this reason, we currently have two days that will need to be made up. We know that we are going to use Friday, May 23rd, as one of these days and are looking at Friday, March 21st, as the other. The March 21st date could change if we have more snow or ice, causing us to cancel school another day this winter. I want to assure you that the decision to delay or cancel school is always made with the safety of our students in mind. There have been some tough calls this year because of the timing when the snow has arrived and because of the amount of ice that we have

had. As always, we try to notify the parents as early as possible so that they can make arrangements for their children. I believe that the "One Call" system that we have been using this year has helped tremendously in this area. If you have not been receiving the "one calls", please contact the District Office immediately at 937-962-2671.

The next couple of weeks will be very important as many of our students will be taking state mandated achievement tests. This can often be a stressful time for our students, but we encourage them to try to relax and just do the best that they can. I know that our teachers have been working very hard to prepare each student for the tests that they will be taking.

Many of these activities could not be offered without your support. # **Elementary School**

Students in grades 2-4 will be taking the Terra Nova tests March 3-7. The Ohio Achievement Tests (OAT) for grades 3 and 4 will be given April 28—May 2 in reading, math and writing. Both of these assessments are VERY important indicators of how students are progressing and they also give us a good overview of the building and grade level progress in those areas. We have carefully analyzed the data from these tests for the last five years to improve instruction, as well as providing intervention and enrichment to all of our students. The results of the Terra Nova tests are usually included in the grade card envelopes in May, while the OAT results come to us in July and are distributed to students the first week of school next year.

The annual 4th grade Science Fair will be held on Tuesday, March 18th. The students have been working on their projects and they will be judged in one of four categories: Physical Science, Earth Science, Life Science or Consumer Science. The top three projects in each category will be recognized and the fair will be open to the public on the 18th from 5:30—7:00 P.M.

Students who participated in our fall fundraiser and qualified for "Jump for George" will be doing that activity in March, as well as the limo ride for students who qualified. The fundraiser was very successful and many thanks goes out to the parents for your support and participation. The funds generated help us with our field trips and many other student related activities. Some of the upcoming field trips include our first graders going to the Indianapolis Zoo, our third graders going to Caesar's Creek and our fourth graders going to Woodland Alters.

Our Before and After School Program for grades I-4 has been a big success! Grades 3 and 4 have been meeting twice a week from 7:30—
8:40 A.M. and will continue to meet through the OAT tests in late April / early May. Grades I and 2 are meeting twice a week from
3:30—4:30 P.M. and will continue to meet until May 8th. Both programs are very beneficial and have been instrumental in improving student achievement and our building and grade level test scores.

# **High School**

TCN Sophomores completed the "Sophomore Academy" the week of February 25 through February 29th. The "Academy", which has become an annual ritual since its' inception in 2005, is a series of daily intensive Ohio Graduation Test (OGT) prep sessions. The sessions are 70 minutes in length and are designed to cover such areas as testing strategies, reading and writing strategies and the core curricular topics. The Academy is meant to serve as one final, concentrated period of time in which students can prepare for the OGT. Student feedback and OGT results from the previous three school years indicate the "Sophomore Academy" has been a successful strategy that compliments the TCN core curriculum. The Sophomore Academy instructors are Anne Karns (social studies), Beth Hough (reading and writing), Teresa Lee (science) and Shari Ferguson (math). This year's OGT

will be administered on March 10-14, 2008.

The Class of 2011 will be TCN's first class to take an off-year OGT in areas of math, science, writing, reading and social studies. The reasons for administering an off-year test to 9th graders include providing additional student preparation and data in an OGT setting. The Terra-Nova offyear test will enable TCN students, teachers, parents and administrators to have consecutive data for students in grades 3 through 10. The results of the ninth grade test should also be able to aid the TCN faculty and administration in determining additional intervention strategies. The off-year test is scheduled for the week of March 10-14 and will be administered at the same time as the OGT.

# Student-Led Conferences Held In MS


