It was nice to see the first week of March as the temperature rose above the freezing point allowing some of the huge snow drifts to melt and our roads to finally clear off. As a result of the weather that we have experienced over the past two months, we have been forced to cancel school six times so far this winter. In comparison, we have been very fortunate as three of the other schools in our county have cancelled nine days each. As the State allows five calamity days this year, we are required to make up one day and have decided to just add this day onto the end of our master calendar making our last day of school for students May 27th. I would like to mention what a wonderful job the villages and township crews have done this winter opening up the roads for our buses so that we could have school on some days when other schools were forced to cancel. During inclement weather, we speak with these gentlemen quite frequently and they are always willing to help out in any way that they can to clear paths so that our buses can travel safely. I also wanted to mention that although the State allowed five calamity days this year, we will only be receiving three days next school year, and will have to

make up all cancelled days two years from now. For this reason, we have built into next year's school calendar two recess days in the spring that we can use as make up days if needed.

Each year as spring approaches, so do the Ohio Achievement Tests for our students. Starting the week of March 15th, we will be giving the Ohio Graduation Test (OGT) to our students in the high school and starting April 19th, we will be giving the Ohio Achievement Assessments (OAA) to our students in grades three through eight. Please make sure that your children get a good nights rest and eat a good breakfast on testing days. I know that our teachers have been working very hard to prepare your children for these tests. Currently it is a requirement that all students in the State of Ohio must pass the OGT before they can earn a high school diploma.

It is hard to believe that we are heading into the fourth nine weeks and soon we will be wrapping up another school year. I would like to thank each of you for supporting our efforts here at Tri-County North!

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Elementary School



TCNES students in grades 2, 3 and 4 finished the Terra Nova assessments and results should be back prior to the end of school this year. Grade 2 took the entire battery of tests, while grades 3 and 4 took only the social studies and science sections.

Grades 3 and 4 are preparing for the state of Ohio Achievement Tests to be given in reading and math the week of April 19-23. Parents are requested to make appointments and other plans around this particular week, as all tests missed for any reason MUST be made up in a short window of time. Testing will start

promptly at 9 am each morning and finish by 12 noon, so students should get a good night's rest, eat a good breakfast and be here on time for the testing each day.

Over 50 students have elected to participate in a Before School tutoring program every Tuesday and Thursday morning from 7:30 am—8:40 am. This program is designed to help prepare the students for the upcoming OAT tests in April, as well as improving their study skills.

A 4th grade parent meeting was held in March to answer any parent ques-

tions about the trip to Woodland Altars May 5-7. Forms are due on March 8th, while the \$55 fee is due on April 9th. All other fees (including past years) are due no later than April 16th. All fees MUST be paid in order to participate in this trip.

An Elementary Fun Night will be held on Friday, April 30th for elementary students and their parents from 4:30—6:30 pm. Watch for more details later this month!

Please note that the last day of school for students is now May 27th!

I love winter and gathering around the fire, but I am anxiously awaiting the arrival of spring and warm weather. With spring comes state testing for the middle school and a great opportunity for students to show what they know. TCNMS will be conducting the Ohio Achievement Assessment, formerly known as the Ohio Achievement Test, from April 20-30th. The 5th and 8th grade students will be taking the Reading, Math, and Science tests and the 6th and 7th grade students will be taking Reading and Math tests. The TCNMS staff worked diligently to prepare students for these tests and anticipate great results. We will be posting the testing schedule on the website for you to see specific dates for each test. Our 8th grade students recently completed the Making Middle Grades Work (MMGW) assessment. Every other year we randomly select 60 students from the 8th grade to take the MMGW assessment. The assessment has four sections: student survey, reading, math, and science. This survey, along with the teacher survey given to our teachers, provide TCNMS with information about our academics, expectations for students, student services, and the high school and career preparedness of our students. The survey will compare our scores with scores of high scoring sites. Each year the MS staff establishes goals through our MMGW Action Plan to work on for the upcoming years. The survey information received will allow our staff to make data driven decisions towards school improvement. TCNMS is dedicated to providing the best education for your children and constant evaluation of our programs allow for this.

Sports Physicals will be offered at Good Samaritan North on Saturday, May 15, 2010 from 8:00 a.m.—11:00 a.m.


The cost is \$10.00 per physical.

Fifth Graders Play CSI!



In January, the fifth grade students had the opportunity to dissect owl pellets. They first learned what an owl pellet is made of (just ask your student). Next, they worked with a partner to carefully pick bones out of the pellet. The students used a bone chart to identify unknown bones and sorted the bones by body parts. Often, there was more than one skeleton (or parts of) to piece together. Afterwards, the students shared their identification of the different prey and predicted the habitat in which the owl lived and preyed. The students also found an "interactive" owl pellet website to do on the Smartboard. Through the use of owl pellets, the fifth graders used process and inquiry skills to investigate the interactions within an ecosystem.

ATTENTION Sophomore Parents!

Why is exercise or physical activity important for children? Increased physical activity has been associated with an increased life expectancy and decreased risk of cardiovascular disease. Physical activity produces overall physical, psychological and social benefits. Inactive children are likely to become inactive adults. And physical activity helps with controlling weight, reducing blood pressure, raising HDL ("good") cholesterol, reducing the risk of diabetes and some kinds of cancer, and improved psychological well-being, including gaining more self-confidence and higher self-esteem. So, how does one promote physical activity in their child? Physical activity should be increased by reducing sedentary time (e.g., watching television, playing computer video games or talking on the phone). Physical activity should be fun for children and adolescents. Parents should try to be role models for active lifestyles and provide children with opportunities for increased physical activity. It is recommended that all children age 2 and older participate in at least 30 minutes of enjoyable, moderate-intensity physical activity every day.
