From The Desk Of The Superintendent William Derringer



We have gotten off to an exciting start this school year. Many projects have been completed to maintain and upgrade our facilities over the past few months. New partitions have been installed in each of the downstairs bathrooms and when you enter our High School you will quickly notice how nice the hallways look as they have been painted gray with red trim. Refinishing the gym floors, resurfacing the blacktop on the kindergarten playground, adding security cameras at the bus garage, and replacing the old swings on the elementary playground are just a few other examples of maintenance projects that took place over this past summer.

We were very proud of our accomplishments on this year's State Report Card. As a District, we received an Effective rating for the sixth consecutive year. Our High School and Elementary School were both rated Excellent! We scored the highest performance index in the county at 96.6, an area where we have improved each of the past four years. We also met 24 of 30 state indicators this year which was an improvement of three indicators over last year's 21 of 30. Our value-added score showed that our students MET one year's worth of growth and we also met AYP (Adequate Yearly Progress) this year, which we had not met in the past two years. All in all, this year's State Report Card shows that TCN has made some great improvements over the past year. I would like to thank each of our students, teachers and administrators for their hard work in making this happen. Our next goal is to achieve an Excellent Rating as a District. This is a goal that we are not far from achieving.

Most of you have probably heard of the many changes that House Bill One (HB1) has required of schools. The changes are much too numerous to mention in this newsletter. If you are interested, you can go to the Ohio Department of Education's website where there is a link ex-

plaining the entire bill. I did, however, want to mention one new requirement of the bill that might impact some of you. Tri-County North will no longer be permitted to collect school fees for any child who's parents have completed the "Sharing Information For School Fee Waiver" form and have been approved to receive free lunches. If this form has not been completed, school fees cannot be waived. Fees for field trips or extra-curricular activities, such as athletics, will still be required.

TCN has been granted three waiver days this year by the Ohio Department of Education for professional development for our teachers. We have selected the dates of October 13, 2009, January 19, 2010, and February 16, 2010, for these waiver days. Students **will not** be in school during this time. You will notice that these days are all on Tuesday's following an existing Monday holiday. This will allow parents to have four day weekends with their children just in case you might be planning an out of town activity. The building will be open on each of these days as our teachers will be receiving professional development.

TCNES kicks off a school wide fundraiser on September 25th and students can take orders through October 5th. All proceeds and profits from the fundraiser are used to help finance field trips, support student activities, purchase classroom supplies and equipment and supplement other costs associated with our students. Students do not collect money until the merchandise arrives on November 5th, with all money due on November 16th. There are several incentives for students and parents should be sure to scan the product brochures, as well as the prize incentives. Thank you for your continuing support and participation.

In addition, our 3rd and 4th graders will have the opportunity to reduce (or completely pay for) their cost of \$55 for the Woodland Altars trip with a McDonald's peeler program in mid-October. The peeler cards are \$10 each and \$4.50 of

each card will be applied to each individual student's cost. The program will last for a few weeks and allow students ample opportunity to take orders. The cost of the trip is \$110 per student, but we are able to reduce that cost significantly with our school-wide fundraiser that is held in late September. Our 3rd and 4th graders will also have the opportunity to reduce their Woodland Altars cost even further with a Market Day pie sale in November, as some of the profits from each of the pies that the students take orders for will be applied to the cost of the Woodland Altars trip. With the McDonald's peelers and the pie sale, each student could earn their entire \$55 for the trip. Any profits over \$55 will be applied to the overall cost of the trip.

Character Education At TCNES



This year our character education program at TCN Elementary will focus on the character trait areas of RESPECT and RESPONSIBILITY. The monthly character trait will be presented to the students during library time with Mrs. Haman, Guidance Counselor, and Mrs. Kubik, Student Assistance Coordinator from Preble County ESC. This monthly program will include reading a story emphasizing the character word, group discussion, role playing, puppetry and craft making. A monthly newsletter will be sent home to inform families of the character word and ways to reinforce the word at home.

Students will also have an opportunity to receive our Panther Spirit Character Award Certificate as they are "caught being good" by our school staff. The student certificates are entered in a monthly drawing. If the student's name is drawn, that student receives a prize from Mrs. Haman.

Abbie Campbell, prevention educator from The Marie Dwyer Recovery Center in Eaton, will also visit our school this year to involve students in the following programs: Tobacco education, Life Skills and Bully Prevention. These programs are provided free of charge to the school through funding from the Mental

Health and Recovery Board in Preble County.

To round out our fall character education programs, our school will recognize Red Ribbon Week in late October with different school activities each day. Red Ribbon Week is a national event which focuses on educating students about making healthy choices including "saying No to Drugs".

Families are encouraged to talk with their children at home about making healthy choices. Together, we can continue to keep our students safe and drug-free in our school and our community.

King Tut Exhibit



On September 14th, the 6th grade students went on a field trip to the Indianapolis Children's Museum to see the King Tut Exhibit. Howard Carter uncovered this remarkably preserved tomb of Tutankhamen. It is the only tomb from its era to be found completely intact with remarkable treasures. King Tut was the most famous of all Egyptian pharaohs because of the rumors of his mysterious curse. It was very interesting for the students to see carvings and handwork made by the Egyptians over 3000 years ago. The cost for students was \$15 per student, but the Lilly Foundation covered the cost for our students, which saved our school and students over \$1530. The 7th grade students will be attending the exhibit on October 5th with the Lilly Foundation covering the cost for them as well.

Reporting A Student's Absence

If your child misses school for any reason, please call the school and notify Mrs. Fullmer, Attendance Secretary, of the reason for their absence. Please send a note in with your child upon their return to school. The notes are required by law and serve as documentation of all absences. While at an appointment with a physician, please request documentation from the office noting your appointment date and time. Parents are only allowed to excuse their children from school for a maximum of ten days per school year. After the ten excused parental absences, a physician's note is required for all future absences. All notes need to include the following information: student's first and last name, date of absence, reason for absence (ill, funeral, etc.), and parent's signature.

If you know that your child will be missing school for vacation, surgery, family matters, etc., please send the information in ahead of time. Please be sure to list all affected dates on the student's absence note. Thank you for your assistance!


