On September 11, 2012, Tri-County North was proud to host the Lewisburg Area Chamber of Commerce annual "State of the Village" meeting in the high school cafeteria. Reports were given from Commissioner Chris Day, Municipal Manager, Jeff Sewert, Village Council member, Don Wright and I. The Chamber recognized the Lewisburg Police Department and the Lewisburg Fire Department and EMTs as their business members of the year. We certainly want to thank all of these people for the outstanding jobs that they do protecting us and keeping our community safe. It was an outstanding night and the groups that were recognized were truly deserving of the awards that they received.

It is amazing how quickly the time passes by. Homecoming marked the halfway point of the first nine weeks and our students have, for the most part, settled into their class routines. We are eagerly awaiting the final results of this year's State Report Card, where preliminary results show some of the best scores that we have ever had as a district. We will be running a renewal levy for operating expenses on November 6th. Once again, I wanted to let everyone know that this levy does not result in an increase in taxes. We are asking for the renewal, which means that all taxpayers would continue to

pay what they are currently paying with NO INCREASE IN TAXES. The 5.1 mil levy generates \$618,000.00 and is used for all of the day to day operating expenses of the district. A levy committee has been formed and will be sending out information over the next several weeks. If you have any questions about the levy, you can always call me at the Tri-County North District Office at (937) 962-2671 and I will do my best to provide answers for you.

The possibility of severe weather is just a few months away. I wanted to remind all of our parents that we will be using the "One Call" system to notify each of you if school is delayed or cancelled. Please be sure to provide all updated phone numbers to Noelle Murray at the District Office so we can accurately get you this important information. We will also place this information on your local television channels, but you will usually get the "One Call" before the message scrolls on the television.

I did want to thank all of our parents and grandparents for your involvement with your child's education. It takes all of us working together to provide the best education possible for our students. As always, your support is greatly appreciated! We look forward to yet another great school year!

The school year has gotten off to a great start and is going by fast. Interim reports have already come home. The Panther Cards are supported by 15 local businesses by providing discounts to patrons who use the card with purchases. The cards are \$10 each and students get to put \$8 of that towards the cost of the trip. In the past, students have paid for their entire trip just by selling the Panther Cards! Cards will be sold starting October 4th through October 25th. HIGH SCHOOL**DOUG DUNHAM**

We are off to a great start here at Tri-County North High School. This year, we are offering our 8th grade students a chance to earn high school credit by taking high school band, Spanish I, French I and Algebra I. The 8th grade students are enrolled in the classes along with freshman students. Also this year, Tri-County North continues to offer dual enrollment classes where students can earn college credit through Indiana University and high school credit in the course of AP English 12, Speech and Personal Finance. Our Vocational Agricultural classes are now: Agricultural Fiber and Natural Resources (AFNR), Animal Science, Agricultural Leadership and Construction Technology.

Project MORE, a program that has been incorporated into the TCN Middle and Elementary schools, is now in the high school as well. Tri-County North has twelve high school students who are mentoring younger students with their reading. All of the mentors received training in Project MORE and each day they spend the class period assisting students in improving their reading skills and comprehension. The high school students receive half elective credit for successfully completing each semester of Project MORE as a mentor. This program is going very well and the students are doing an outstanding job as mentors.

This website provides a number of key features you find beneficial including: scheduled recurring payments, automatic deposits when your child's account balance runs low, extended purchase history for the past 90 days and low balance email notifications. Your existing username and password for MyNutrikids.com will remain the same at mySchoolBucks. You should experience little to no interruption during this transition. The convenience fee for cafeteria account deposits will be \$1.95, which will cover all deposits made within a single transaction. 

VIP HOLD FALL FLING

PROJECT MORE NEWS

TCN students are currently in their third year of Project MORE. Project MORE stands for Mentoring in Ohio for Reading Excellence. Project MORE is a volunteer reading mentoring project to significantly improve reading levels of diverse learners and students not making reading benchmarks at their grade level. Students in sixth grade through high school have been trained to be mentors. Project MORE students work 1:1 with their mentors Monday through Friday for thirty minutes each day. Each lesson is specific to the mentee's reading level and concentrates on reading fluency, vocabulary and comprehension.
