Each year as we enter the start of another school year we have new employees that we recognize during our opening day meeting. This year will be no different as we will greatly miss the seven wonderful employees who retired at the end of last school year. They are: Sue Finton with 28 years of service, Rhonda Horn and Kathy Marshall with 27 years of service, Kathy Brown with 18 years, Glenda Bean with 17 years, Beverly League with 11 years and Larry Finton with 10 years of service. Total, they represent 138 years of service to the Tri-County North Local School District. We would like to thank them for all that they have done to make our school a better place and wish them the best as they enter into their retirement. TCN will greatly miss each of them!

As always, summer is a busy time around the school. Last year we replaced the sidewalks in front of the school and added a new courtyard/main entrance. This summer we have been working down at the stadium to replace the nearly 30 year old retaining wall that was constructed from old railroad ties which have been deteriorating over the years. We have decided to put a second tier in for lawn chairs and also pour concrete where there used to be gravel across the top of the hill. As this has truly been a community project, I would like to thank Jeff Sewert and the Village of Lewisburg, especially Josh Meyers and Josh Harry for the hours that they have spent working on the project. I would also like to thank Bryan Statzer, Woodyard Electric, Anderson Pallet, Ed Rike Plumbing, Harrison Township, Lewisburg Village Employees, the TCN Football Team, and all of the other volunteers who have donated their time to help with this project. Lastly, I would like to thank Stinson Concrete for the extra time and effort that they have put into the concrete work to make the project a success. The improvements that we have made with this project were long overdue and really make "The Hill" one of the nicest places to watch an event in our area.

This summer we also decided to purchase a new truck and van to replace the 1996 truck and the 1994 van that have been inadequate for the past several years. We utilized the competitive bidding process from the Educational Purchasing Coop of Southwest Ohio and received a great price on both of these vehicles. We also used Casino Revenue money to pay for these purchases. By utilizing money that we receive from the state when people enjoy Ohio casinos, we were able to buy these vehicles without using any taxpayer dollars.

We will, once again, be utilizing the "One Call" system this year should we have any type of inclement weather which would require our school to be delayed or cancelled. 2017-2018 Lunch Fees

Effective the 2017-2018 school year, lunch fees will be increasing by ten cents each. This is the first increase TCN has seen in three years and is required as part of the federal lunch program. Prices will be as follows: K-5—\$2.60, 6-8—\$2.85, and 9-12—\$3.10. Breakfast prices will remain the same at \$1.75.

Every student who enters the building will have the attitude that anything is possible with our new "Mission Possible" theme.

Excitement and anticipation is in the air with the school year about to begin. The maintenance staff has been working hard over the summer to have a clean and fresh building for staff and students to enjoy. As students return, they will notice a few changes we have made to improve the academic environment here at Tri-County North. A few of these changes I will touch on in this newsletter include increasing the learning expectations of our students through advanced course offerings, providing extra help for our students, and scheduling an advisory period to further develop positive relationships between our staff and students.

Did you know that starting next year a Tri-County North graduate could earn up to 24 semester hours of college credit, along with advanced placement credit in English and Calculus, while taking classes taught by Tri-County North faculty? Along with the expansion of our college credit plus (CCP) course offerings, Tri-County North also offers math acceleration to students who qualify in grades 6 and 7, resulting in 8th graders being able to study high school algebra. The increase in course offerings at Tri-County North will result in more academic rigor, while also reducing the amount of study halls and student aide positions available.

Tri-County North is also excited about programs designed to offer extra help to our students. Next school

year, the media center will be open until 3:00 every day for students to study and work on homework after normal school hours. This past school year, we offered an exam boot camp where students had a place to prepare for their semester exams, and this is a practice we will continue this school year. We are also working on a remediation program to assist students with meeting their graduation testing requirements.

A daily 15 minute advisory period will be added to each students schedule this school year to increase positive relationships between students and staff and work on the development of the whole child. During this time, teachers will have conversations with students about their academic progress, utilizing progress book as a data source. Noncognitive skill work, such as character development and addiction awareness will also be addressed during this time. One of the goals of this advisory period is to develop activities to improve student pride in being a panther.

I believe that these improvements to the Tri-County North curriculum will be a great addition to our school. I am looking forward to the new school year and the hallways being filled with spirit and energy. VOLUME 11, ISSUE 1 PAGE 3

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Curriculum Corner Beth Manor

As we begin a new school year, it is with great pride that we are able to report that we have seen significant growth in our tested subject areas. While the official district report cards won't be released by the Ohio Department of Education until mid-September, we are already hard at work reflecting on what worked well and continuing to plan on how we can do better. One of the most important factors in a child's educational journey is the relationship between the parents/community and the school. Over the past three years, our district leadership team has made a conscious effort to engage with our parents and community more. As we have moved our district to school-wide Title I schools, we have been constantly trying to figure out more ways to make our students and your children more successful here at TCN. So, please keep a close tab on our district's Facebook page and website as we plan to continue to bring your more information on how we (You and Us!) can strengthen this relationship for the betterment of all of our kids.

In the areas of curriculum and instruction, we also have been making some changes so that we can better serve our students as they prepare to lead our community into the middle of the 21st century. As I am sure you have heard on the news and social media, there is a lot of talk about preparing kids to be college and career ready for the 21st century. We are very excited to be able to share with you that we will be launching our 1 to 1 digital pilot this year and will be gearing up to move our 6-12 students to being 1 to 1 with a chromebook by the beginning of the 18-19 school year. This planning year is going to consist of the district working closely with our teachers, media specialist, and technology coordinator to ensure that we have the policies and procedures ready for us to embrace a blended learning environment that will undoubtedly help our students become more engaged in their learning. However, we need to be clear, there is still tremendous benefit from opening a traditional printed book, participating in an actual lab dissection in science class, completing that math problem without a calculator, and creating that hands-on history project. In addition, though, we are very excited to be able to bring new web-based programs that can be used here at school and at home to help our students improve their knowledge base. Here's an overview of just a few of the new resources we will be using K-12!

Newsela PRO—This program provides high interest reading content and instruction in all content areas. This will be primarily used at the middle and high school levels. https://newsela.com

Membean—This program builds a student's vocabulary by exposing them to written, audio, video, and graphic/artistic explanations of thousands of words. The game-like format also helps students succeed in overcoming short attention spans. http://membean.com

GIZMOS—This program is a web-based science experimentation and math site that allows teachers to explore scientific and mathematical simulations that would not be able to be addressed in the confines of a normal classroom. www.explorelearning.com

While this not an complete list of the new technology enhanced resources that our teachers and district will be using, it does provide you with a sample of the new types of engaging (and really cool!) resources that we are bringing to TCN. Check out the links, and please contact me if you have any questions. Look for the curriculum demonstration table at Open House. The instructional vision for our district is to be able to serve our students with the best of both worlds and open our students' eyes to what it means to be able to critically think, collaborate, and create in a rapidly changing world.

Lastly, in terms of assessment, the Ohio General Assembly and Governor Kasich will undoubtedly have some changes that apply to public education.
