Elementary School News

Tri-County North Elementary is focusing on the positive during 2019 - 2020 school year. TCNES will be implementing Positive Behavior Intervention Supports (PBIS) and the PAX Good Behavior Game® throughout the school year. What is PBIS and PAX, you ask? PBIS is a school wide system of support that includes proactive strategies for defining, teaching, and supporting appropriate student behaviors in order to create a positive school environment. Several staff members have been working on our PBIS system during the 2018-19 school year and over the 2019 summer to prepare for the upcoming year. We are excited to start the year off on a positive note. PAX is a powerful evidence-based practice, consisting of proven instructional and behavioral health strategies used daily by teachers and students in the classroom. This universal preventive approach not only improves classroom behavior and academics, but also provides a lifetime of benefits for every child by improving self-regulation and co-regulation with peers. TCNES has partnered with the Montgomery County Educational Service Center and financial support from the Preble County Mental Health and Recovery Board to assist us with the implementation on the PAX Good Behavior Game®. Staff and students will receive on-going training throughout the school year to implement the PAX Good Behavior Game®. We are excited to take on these two initiatives to better our staff and students at TCNES. Looking forward to another great year at TCNES!

Middle School News

The staff at Tri-County North Middle School is excited for the start of the 2019-20 school year. Although the students are not in the building during the summer, the building can still be a very busy place. Lockers, classrooms, and hallways have been cleaned, 6th grade classrooms have been painted, and the floors have been waxed. The lecture room has been completely renovated and looks fantastic. The new playground is ready for students to begin playing on this fall. We have had a few staffing changes over the summer, which we believe will improve the school district.

Mrs. Stacy Williams has moved from being a 5th grade language arts teacher and will now be restarting our STEM program along with working with students identified as being "gifted". Mrs. Dawn Grube will be taking over 5th grade language arts. Mrs. Grube will be teaching a curriculum based off of the teacher's college reading and writing project (TCRWP) through Columbia University, which aims to help our middle school students become avid and skilled readers, writers, and inquirers. These goals are accomplished through using and workshop model and performance assessments to teach literacy. And along with being TCN's new varsity football coach, Mr. Matt Money will be teaching 5th grade math. Mr. Money comes highly recommended as a teacher from Hamilton City Schools, where he was a 5th grade math teacher.

In the middle school, we believe it is essential to teach the positive behaviors we expect our students to display throughout the day. Within the first week of school, students will be taught expectations in the hallways, cafeteria, bus, assemblies/events, restrooms, and classrooms. In all of these areas, students are encouraged to R.O.A.R. (be Respectful, Organized, Accountable, and Resilient). We will have quarterly awards for students exemplifying this behavior throughout the year to promote these positive actions. Here's to another great year at TCN! Go Panthers!

History Day Competition

And congratulations to Devin Corrington and Parker Williams who won first place in the Junior Division Group Exhibit category and, for the second year in a row, advanced to the National History Day Competition in June. The National Competition was held in June at the University of Maryland over a five day period. Students from all over the world compete because of Department of Defense schools. The welcome ceremony took place on Sunday evening and judging of the projects was conducted on Monday afternoon. Devin and Parker's project focused on the dogs and dog handlers of the Vietnam War. They researched their project by talking to former dog handlers and listened to their many stories about their lives with their dogs in the war. On Wednesday, Devin and Parker were selected to represent Ohio and display their project at the Museum of American History at the Smithsonian. The closing ceremony was held on Thursday and Devin and Parker received Outstanding Entry medals and Honorable Mention certificates for the second year in a row. Fourth Grade Trip To Carillon Park

Upon arrival they were able to hear the magnificent Carillon bells where they learned about the founders of the park. Carillon Park is home to one of five nests in the Dayton area. Ornithologists were eager to share interesting facts about the life cycle of a bald eagle with the students as well as showing them recent photos of the eagle parents and their eggs that were right on campus. Many of the exhibits allowed for students to have a visual of historical events they learned about in Social Studies class.
