From The Desk Of The Superintendent

As we prepare for the start of another school year, I would like to share some information with you about a couple of new and exciting things that we will be doing this fall.

First, we have decided to open our very own "Wee Panthers Preschool", which will allow us for the first time ever, to offer an in-house preschool as a part of our elementary school. We will be starting out with two classrooms that could support an enrollment of 16 students each. There will be an A.M. preschool with afternoon daycare as well as a P.M. preschool with morning daycare. We will also offer lunch, snacks and transportation to and from school for any preschool student who stays the entire day. It is our hope that by adding this preschool, as well as working with Head Start, the preschool at the Preble County ESC, Panther Prep and Kids Connection preschools located in Lewisburg, we can better prepare our incoming students each year for kindergarten and provide experiences for them to be more successful throughout their time here at TCN. Please contact Noelle Rhoades at the Tri-County North District Office if you would like to sign your child up for the Wee Panthers Preschool. We currently still have spots available on a first come first serve basis.

I would also like to inform you of the new track and field turf project that has been underway down at our stadium this summer. I know that many in the community are excited to see this project when it is finished. Currently, the turf is nearing completion and then they will complete the track. The funding for this project has come from a variety of sources including: federal grant funds, casino revenue funds, permanent improvement funds and our general fund. We have also made numerous improvements to the drainage around the stadium to protect our investment. We believe that upon its completion, this facility will be one of the finest in our area and something that our community will truly be proud of. Not only will the facility be used for football and soccer, but we have already scheduled an awesome band competition, as well as the WOAC league track meet this year. It will be utilized by physical education classes during the day, practices after school and the track will also be open in the evening hours for Tri-County North community members to walk if they choose. We will be planning a dedication ceremony in the near future to foster excitement about the new facility.

These are just a couple of the exciting things that I wanted to share with you. There have also been many other projects this summer that have been improvements for TCN that your children will notice when they return. School starts back for students on Wednesday, August 17th. Enjoy the rest of your summer and let's get off to a great start this year!

I would like to start off by saying thank you for the great experience of being able to work at Tri-County North as a principal for these past six school years. I am very proud of the progress the school district has made and some of the projects that I have helped implement and lead. Specifically, before the COVID-19 pandemic, the middle school had seen increasingly better performance index scores on the achievement component of the state report card and recently has seen above expected student growth in every grade level and subject area. We accomplished this by focusing first on people and culture, then curriculum, assessment, and intervention/enrichment. Tri-County North has a top-notch staff with outstanding teachers. We have implemented innovative programs such as PBIS, RTI, an activity period called panther time, and a 1:1 chromebook computing program. As a school, we have participated in "one book, one school", and brought in authors to speak to the students about the importance of literacy. We have added a class to students' schedules called math enrichment, focusing on individualized math skills. We navigated the COVID-19 pandemic, helped our students and teachers transition to home instruction, and gave students the option of a virtual academy during the 2019-20 school year.

With bittersweet emotions of leaving a great situation at Tri-County North, I have accepted a new opportunity as I have been offered the Superintendent position at Covington Exempted Village Schools. It is my hope that the new Middle School principal is able to build on this progress and take Tri-County North middle school to new heights. I am very grateful for all of the opportunities, experiences, and support that I have had from the Tri-County North community and wish you continued success in the future.

School Lunch Fees

Children need healthy meals to learn. Tri-County North Local Schools offers healthy meals each school day. Breakfast costs for grades K-12 (\$1.75); Lunch costs for grades Pre K-5 (\$2.60); Lunch costs for grades 6-8 (\$2.85); Lunch costs for grades 9-12 (\$3.10). Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced-price meals. Reduced price is \$.30 for breakfast and \$.40 for lunch. A Note From The Nurse



Hello everyone! My name is Cassi Harris and I am your child's School Nurse. A little background information about myself: I grew up in Lewisburg and graduated from Tri-County North. After graduation, I enrolled in nursing school to become an RN and worked at Dayton Childrens Hospital in the emergency department. In 2019, I left Dayton Childrens and began working at the Preble County ER in Eaton. In 2020, I graduated with my Masters of Nursing Administration degree. When the opportunity to become the school nurse at TCN arose back in 2021, I couldn't pass up working with all of these wonderful children! I am excited to spend many more years here at TCN working with parents and students.

I hope that you all had a wonderful summer! Just a few reminders: I have attached the Immunization Requirements for school attendance. Please make sure that your child is up to date on these immunizations so that they are not at risk for being withheld from school. Also, if your student has any medications that they are required to take during the school day, please make sure that you have their physician fill out the medication order form. Once the form is complete, an adult will have to bring the medication to the school to be checked in by myself and the adult bringing in the medication. There is an electronic copy of the medication form located on the school nurse page on the TCN website, as well as the Forms tab under Families. Last but not least, the Mobile Dentist will be at TCN on 9/7/22, as well as 3/7/23.
