Middle School News

Welcome back! The TCN District vision is "Preparing for Tomorrow by Expecting Excellence Today!" This concept is embedded in our Middle School students through consistent activities and lessons that prepare them to be "high school ready!" Success in high school requires social, emotional, and academic growth. Last year our students and staff engaged in multiple activities and events encouraging advancement in these areas. Some of these were 5th and 8th grade career days, music concerts, Cincinnati Reds Straight-A and PBIS incentive programs, Hope Squad, Girls on the Run, Stem Club and STEM/robotics competitions, science fair, School Smiles (mobile dentist), athletics, field trips, school book read (Wonder), dances, Shoes for Shoeless, Leadership Conference at Wright State University, trips to Michigan and Washington D.C., and even summer school!

TCN Middle School further strengthened academics by developing a course catalog and creating a 2023-24 schedule with an increase in instructional minutes (without changing the start/end times of the school day). Restart Readiness Assessments were given for the first time, allowing staff to teach students with laser-like precision while closing learning gaps. Additional classes are being offered including Physical Well-Being (Health/P.E.) classes for 7th & 8th grades and Social Skills (grade 5). Response To Intervention (RTI) strategies evolved to include more small group and individual support for struggling students.

Due to strong efforts by MS Science teacher Mrs. Barnes, all three TCN buildings received <u>The Purple Star Designation</u> from the State Department of Education for "showing a major commitment to students and families connected to our nation's military." TCN's website contains a page dedicated to helping our military families connect to useful resources. The TCN Middle School looks forward to another exciting year of positive growth in our students. We strongly encourage your child's involvement in extracurricular activities. Nurse's News

Hello everyone! I hope that you all had a wonderful summer with your loved ones! Exciting things have been happening at our school this past year! Tri-County North is now officially certified as a heart safe school through Cincinnati Children's and Project ADAM. TCN is the first school in Preble County, as well as the Dayton area, to become certified as a heart safe school. Project ADAM began in 1999 after the death of Adam Lemel, a 17 year old Whitefish Bay, WI, high school student who collapsed and died while playing basketball. Adam suffered a sudden cardiac arrest, in which ventricular fibrilla- Heart Safe School tion occurred, a condition in which the ventricles cannot pump blood into the body. Defibrillation, or project ADAM an AED, could have saved his life. A school is designated as a Heart Safe School after it has successfully



implemented a quality sudden cardiac arrest program of awareness, training and effective emergency response to promote a safe environment for students, visitors and staff. The staff will be conducting multiple Cardiac Response Drills throughout the school years to come to ensure that in an emergency we are well prepared. As you visit our building in the future, please make note of where all of the AEDs are located in case of emergencies.

Immunization Reminders: If you have a student that is attending preschool this upcoming school year, please make sure that their updated Child Medical Statement and up-to-date immunizations are turned in. Kindergarten students are required to have up-to-date immunization records turned in as well. If you have an upcoming 7th grade or 12th grade student, please make sure that they have received their required immunizations before returning to school in August and turn in an updated immunization record. As a reminder, there is an option for a waiver form for immunizations if you have a medical or religious reason for exemption.

The School Smiles Program will be returning to our school this upcoming year and they offer cleaning, fluoride, x-rays, crowns, sealants, restorations, and extractions. Did you know that oral health can affect your student's overall health and well being? If uncontrolled, bacteria in the mouth can multiply and eventually enter the bloodstream, affecting all parts of the body, making your student feel very ill. Also, oral health issues such as cavities can impact your students ability to learn by causing a decreased appetite, depression, and inability to focus attention- all of which can lead to a risk of lower school attendance and learning performance. Studies have shown that children who have limited preventive care will miss three times as many school days due to oral health problems. Many oral health conditions are preventable with early treatment. Tri-County North is excited to provide the opportunity for students to receive oral health care right here in the comfort of their own school! The School Smiles program is scheduled to be at Tri- County North on September 11 & 12, 2023 and again on March 11 & 12, 2024. Please fill out the online registration form at the start of the school year if you are interested in having your child seen by the school smiles dentist program.

Medication Reminders: All prescription medications are required to have an order on file with a physician signature, and are to be brought to the school by an adult in the original container. The medication order forms are located on the Tri-County North website, under the school nurse page.

Extra Clothes: Please make sure that your elementary student has a change of clothes in their backpack the entire school year to include a shirt, pants, and underwear in case of any accidents that may occur. That way the student is able to come to the clinic restroom, get cleaned up and have clothes to wear that fit them appropriately as I have a limited supply of clothes and do not always have a size that would fit every student.

6th Grade Dearborn, MI Trip

The 6th grade class took a trip to Dearborn, Michigan on May 11 & 12th. They went to the Ford truck plant where they saw the assembly line of the F150 and the history of Henry Ford.
