Final Forms can be accessed through the Tri-County North website and is required to be updated every year before school starts. By having the correct information in FinalForms, you will also be current in ParentSquare and will receive the text and voice messages when needed.

We also have several new teachers this year which I am sure are excited to start working with your children. Don't forget to mark on your calendars that we will be having an Open House on Monday August 12th, from 5:00 to 6:30 p.m. so that would be a good time to come and meet your child's newest teachers. I believe that our principals have done an outstanding job this summer of hiring some excellent additions to the already great staff that we currently have.

We hope that this newsletter provides you with some very important information that you can use for the entire first semester. I know that the upcoming events section as well as the athletic calendar should help you with future planning of school events. ES Teachers Win Grant/Trip To Hawaii
