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FROM THE DESK OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

So far it has been a mild winter and we have made it through the first semester without using any calamity days. As most of you know, we utilize the "One Call" notification system in the event of an emergency, a two hour delay or a school closing. If you have not provided a phone number for our database or if you experience any other issues or problems with our One Call system, please contact Noelle Warner at the District Office at 937-962-2671 and she can help you with your issue. Our goal is to try to provide you with the best communication possible when these situations occur. We will still place most information on the local TV and radio stations as well for those who have family and friends that may not be in our system.

As laws and issues concerning education are constantly changing, this year has been no different. On December 10th, President Obama signed into a law a bipartisan bill to reauthorize the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) of 1965. The new reauthorization legislation is known as the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). ESEA was last reauthorized more than a decade ago as the NO Child Left Behind Act (NCLB). The new law reaffirms the importance of local governance, protects federal investments under Title I for disadvantaged students and prevents the diversion of public tax dollars for private use. The house passed the ESSA bill December 2nd, with the Senate approval coming December 9th. For the second year in a row, I would like to thank our friends at Cargill Incorporated who made another donation for our TCN Hot Meal Fund for students. The dollars that were donated will allow students who are not on free or reduced lunches, but who might be struggling at the time, to receive a tray lunch in our cafeteria. This provides the opportunity for all of our students to receive a healthy meal. This would not be possible without the donation from Cargill Incorporated.

K-5 NEWS

Students at TCNES will have an opportunity to participate in an archery club this school year. While students receive instruction in archery and safety during their physical education classes in grades 3 – 5, we are going to start an after school club for students to extend their learning. Our archery club will be practicing after school on Tuesdays and Thursdays in January through February. Other local Preble County schools have started to teach archery in their physical education classes and we are hoping to have local competitions among the schools. The archery club would also be eligible to participate in the Ohio Department of Natural Resources sponsored statewide National Archery in the Schools Program competition in March that is held at the Arnold Sports Festival. There are over 1800 archers competing in this competition. Competition groups consist of grades 4th – 6th. We are excited about the opportunities this will open for our students at TCN.

As 2016 arrives so does planning for the 2016-17 school year. April 11th – 15th will be the week Tri-County North registers incoming kindergartners for the 2016-17 school year. Registration can be done at the District Office with Noelle Warner, Secretary to the Superintendent. Early registration allows TCN to plan for our incoming kindergartners and allows the kindergarten students to obtain some materials they can use all summer to prepare for kindergarten. More information will come soon, but if you know of anyone who will be of kindergarten age, please let them know they need to register. We hope to see all kindergartners during the week of April 11th – 15th!

6-12 NEWS

As we finish up the first semester, the 2015-2016 school year is going by very quickly. The students will now be starting their second semester on January 4, 2016. This school year was the first year of the College Credit Plus (CCP) program where students in grades 7th-12th, if they met certain requirements, could take college courses while attending high school. At Tri-County North, we have 32 students taking college courses through Sinclair Community College or Indiana University. Some students attend on campus of the college or take on-line courses. We also offer courses taught by Tri-County North teachers who are adjunct college professors for the colleges. These classes are completely paid for by Tri-County North. If your son/daughter is interested in enrolling in the CCP program next school year, there will be a mandatory parent meeting (for students who have not previously taken CCP courses) on Thursday, February 11, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. in the lecture room.

In addition to the College Credit Plus program, Tri-County North Middle/High School offers students the opportunity to complete high school and middle school courses through an on-line program and they are monitored and assisted by a full-time teacher. This program is used for students who may have fallen behind in credits, could not get the course they needed in their schedule, or Tri-County North does not offer the class.

Currently, we have 10 students who are enrolled full-time in the on-line program, and 17 students who take at least one course on-line during the school day. Our full-time teacher also monitors after school study table from 2:15 p.m.-3:00 p.m. each day for any student who may need tutoring, waiting for sports practice, or need to use a computer for assignments.

Our last new program to Tri-County North to highlight is the Science Technology Engineering and Math (STEM) program for the middle and high school. The middle school students are provided an introductory nine week course learning about the STEM program. At the high school, students can enroll in the semester course called Modeling/Simulation where they are understanding and working knowledge of live, virtual constructive simulation, as well as physical, mathematical and process modeling through the use of lab challenges and computer programming. We encourage high school students to enroll in this course next school year.

CURRICULUM CORNER

The mid-point of the school year is rapidly approaching and the curriculum initiatives at TCN are going strong. This fall, our teachers have been spending a dedicated amount of time each week meeting in teacher based teams. These grade level and departmentalized teams are dedicated to analyzing student's learning outcomes and then finding collaborative ways to enhance the teaching and learning opportunities of their collective students. Our focus this fall has been increasing student achievement through the use of reading and writing in all of our content areas. One of the 21st century skills that we are hoping to foster is more critical thinking and perseverance through difficult tasks. This is reflected in our students having to read, write, and be able to explain their thinking across our curriculum from kindergarten through high school.


This also connects to the new types of assessments that are being given to our students. Over the summer, the state of Ohio changed testing vendors from the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) to American Institutes for Research (AIR). AIR is the same vendor that had previously created the Ohio Achievement Assessments and the Ohio Graduation Tests. We are very pleased that the testing window has also been adjusted to lessen the test anxiety and over testing

of our students. At this time, we have successfully just completed the first round of AIR testing this year with our 3rd grade English Language Arts test. This test will serve as a baseline for our students having to meet the Third Grade Reading Guarantee. Students in grades 4-11 will be taking all the required Ohio Computer Based Assessments in late April through early May. Please look for further information coming out from your child's teacher or school as we get closer to the spring testing window.

While taking tests are an important skill as they progress through school, it's even more important for our children to develop the willingness to continue to grow and develop as life-long learners.

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
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
